

PASSENGER STATIONS & STOPS

GWR (1-36), LMSR (50-88), LNER (100-123), SR (150-166), Independent Railways (200-292), Preserved Railways (300-312) and Electric Tramways (350-362).

The aim of this list is to include information for some lesser known railways and tramways in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. Some of these lines were not included in Bradshaws Guide. Others were included only briefly and/or only operated a public passenger service for a short period. I have included most of these short lived services, generally where they lasted for less than about 10 years, were more than about 1 mile in length or included at least one intermediate station. For fuller information on short lived services, I recommend "Closed Passenger Lines of Great Britain 1827-1947", Greville & Spence, RCHS and "Passengers No More" covering closures 1919-1963, Daniels & Dench, Ian Allan. Both have been long out of print, but I am not aware of any other comprehensive publication including all discontinued passenger services. I have also included most of the smaller Independent Railways that survived the 1923 Grouping.

I have included most (but not all) lines that were only served by unadvertised and restricted services for workers, sports events, visitors to hospitals, boat trains, private landowners, military, railway employees etc. These included scheduled miners services to collieries (excluding collieries only served by occasional seasonal excursions) and government workers services to remote munitions factories (Royal Ordnance Factories – R.O.F.) set up in WW1 and WW2. Additionally, there were several 100's of other unadvertised stations and halts on lines served by advertised passenger services. With a few exceptions, these are not included in this list, but I have included a few such lines on which there were a considerable number of miners halts (e.g. in South Wales). Private & Untimetabled Railway Stations (Croughton Kidner & Young), Railway Passenger Stations Chronology (Quick), Midland Railway Chronology (Gough), the Complete Atlas of Railway Station names (Dewick)* and Atlas of the Great Western Railway (Cooke) are recommended for more information on unadvertised stations and halts (see References for full details). * but please note this atlas does contain a number of errors and omissions.

I have included some Preserved Railways, generally only those now closed or with stations both opened and closed in preservation days (this information not being included in Quick's Chronology).

A number of electric & horse tramways have also been included, generally confined to those that had some light railway or "interurban" characteristics. In most cases, information has only been found for fare stages. See separate lists for Blackpool & Fleetwood Tramway and Manx Electric Railway. prw: private right of way
